CALL OUT FOR A TREATY 8 FIRST NATIONS OF ALBERTA HEALTH CO-MANAGEMENT REPRESENTATIVES FOR THE FOLLOWING SUBCOMMITTEES:

- **Operations & Support (2 Reps required)**
 - *Oversight and guidance of FNIHB's programs and consider issues, make decisions or recommendations on matters relating to: program allocations and management of resources, quality of program delivery; monitor strategic priorities, etc. The subcommittee shares the decision-making responsibility for the following programs: Aboriginal Health Services Accreditation, Capital & Facility Management, E-Health, Health Consultation & Liaison, HSIF, and Health Planning & Management.*
- **Children & Youth (2 Reps required)**
 - *Advocating for children and youth working towards caring for positive change in the development of our greatest resource, our children. The subcommittee shares decision-making responsibility for the following programs: AHSOR, CPNP, FASD, & MCH.*
- **Health Protection (2 Reps required)**
 - *Considers responses to health concerns including cancer cluster investigations, water quality and other various environmental public health and communicable disease issues throughout the year. The subcommittee shares decision-making responsibility for the following programs: Communicable Disease Control, Blood Borne Pathogens, TB Control and Environmental Health.*
- **Prevention Programs (2 Reps required)**
 - *Goal is to promote the proactive prevention of injury and illness in the communities including other strategies such as nursing recruitment and retention and continuing care. The subcommittee shares decision-making responsibility for the following programs: ADI, CHRs, Home & Community Care, IP, Nursing and Nutrition.*
- **Non-Insured Health Benefits (2 Reps required)**
 - *Work to ensure the delivery of non-insured health benefits to FN's clients living both on and off reserve. The subcommittee shares decision-making responsibility for the following programs: Dental, MT, Mental Health and Pharmacy & Vision.*
- **Mental Health & Addictions (2 Reps required)**
 - *Caring for mental health & addictions in the communities is a primary concern. The subcommittee shares decision-making responsibility for the following programs: Brighter Futures/Building Healthy Communities, Canada Drug Strategy, NAYSPS, NADS, NNADAP, YSAP and IRS Support.*

The criteria are as follows:

- ✚ Be familiar with the subcommittee's work;
- ✚ Must be over 18 years of age;
- ✚ Must be a member of Treaty 8 Territory and/or working for a Treaty 8 organization;
- ✚ Have reliable transportation to attend meetings and be willing to travel within Alberta;
- ✚ Be willing to be accountable to the Treaty 8 communities and members;
- ✚ Accessibility to email and phone; and
- ✚ Will be representing all 24 Treaty 8 communities/members.

The Representative will be appointed by the Treaty 8 First Nations of Alberta Executive Board of Chiefs. The appointment will be for a maximum of 2 years. Should either party wish to terminate, a written 30-day notice of termination must be provided to Treaty 8 First Nations of Alberta or vice versa. The Subcommittee rep will be covered for travel & accommodation expenses for attending the subcommittee meetings unless you reside in Edmonton as majority of meetings are held in Edmonton.
